## Spotlight: The Best of the Best

### Judy Miller wins Day in Hades Tournament in on-course playoff

Judy Miller is on a roll! Within a one month period she won two AWGA tournaments, the Weekend Classic in Flagstaff and the Day In Hades in Marana. That is quite an accomplishment for any golfer and the year is only half over! Judy moved to Arizona in 2005 and it is apparent that she quickly became acclimated to the Arizona climate since she began winning tournaments almost immediately, and continues, even in the scorching heat this summer.

*"It was extremely hot for the Day In Hades Tournament," Judy recalled. "Not keeping track of who the leaders were, I finished my last hole and when I went inside I was told that there would be a playoff and I was in it. We ate lunch and then Megan Buck and I headed back onto the course. We had only two observers, Chris Giza and Tui Selvaratnam, who were willing to brave the heat with us!" She continued, "I hit two straight shots down the fairway, then an accurate chip shot which stopped about 12 inches from the hole. I putted it in for a birdie and won the playoff. It was really an exciting moment for me."*

Judy was presented with the AWGA Senior Player of the Year Award in 2007 and she is continually adding titles to her record. Her most recent accomplishments are:

Judy and her husband, Al, enjoy playing golf together at home in Tucson and when they travel. Her motto is "Have Clubs Will Travel" and her clubs have put quite the mileage on! Judy has played golf all over Arizona in AWGA tournaments and across the nation in USGA events. "Going to Tulsa Country Club for the US Senior Women's Amateur Championship in September 2008 was quite an experience for me," Judy remembers. "It was an exceptional course and the people were so welcoming and helpful. I was playing a practice round with Chris Giza and a very friendly and gracious man was her caddie. We later found out that he was the President of Tulsa Country Club!" There's something to be said about that southern hospitality! Judy will be playing in the US Senior Women's Amateur Championship Qualifying event at Desert Mountain on August 10th and then hopefully will be heading to Hot Springs, Virginia for the US Senior Women's Championship in September.

# RULES

## Rule 28 – Ball Unplayable

The player may declare her ball unplayable at any place on the course except when the ball is in a water hazard. The player is the sole judge as to whether her ball is unplayable.

If the player deems her ball to be unplayable, she shall, under penalty of one stroke:

- a. Play a ball as nearly as possible at the spot from which the original ball was last played; or
  - b. Drop a ball behind the point where the ball lay, keeping that point directly between the hole and the spot on which the ball is dropped, with no limit to how far behind that point the ball may be dropped; or
  - c. Drop a ball within two club-lengths of the spot where the ball lay, but no nearer the hole.
- If the unplayable ball is in a bunker, the player may proceed under Clause a, b or c. If she elects to proceed under Clause b or c, a ball must be dropped in the bunker. The ball may be cleaned when lifted under this Rule.

**Q.** A player hits her tee shot into the desert. The player immediately declares the ball unplayable and plays another ball from the tee under the stroke-and-distance option of Rule 28a. May a player declare a ball unplayable which has not been found?

**A.** Yes a player may proceed under the stroke-and-distance option (Rule 28a) without finding her ball. The player then plays from the teeing ground and she is allowed to re-tee the ball.

However, since Rules 28b and c require reference to where the ball lay, the player must find and identify his ball in order to proceed under either of these options.

# EQUIPMENT

## GOLF CLUBS: THE LONG AND SHORT OF IT

### Part One

Have you ever wondered what length your irons should be? The correct length allows you to hit the ball on the sweet spot, have the appropriate ball flight, and the option to work the ball. Be aware, there is not one standard. Each manufacturer has their own standard and it may not be the same as another manufacturer.

Also, just because you are short does not mean you necessarily need shorter clubs. Conversely, if you are tall, extra long clubs aren't necessarily the appropriate length. Club length is determined by body proportions, the static measurements of the distance from your wrist to the floor, and your position at address. Dynamically the correct length is that which enables you to consistently hit the center of the club face when swinging correctly. It's easier to swing a club that is the correct length and that keeps the fun in the game!

# TECHNIQUE

## Proper Right Hand Release & Extension

Many women come to me saying that all their irons seem to go the same distance and/or they hit behind the ball. What I believe is happening is their non-target side hand is releasing too soon from the top and they create the same loft on every iron at impact. The palm of the non-target side hand is the face of the club, so the palm should be moving toward the target at impact (not down).

A simple drill and one of my favorite is the "split grip drill." Grip the club with about 3 inches between your hands. You will be standing closer to the ball and your non-target side arm will be at full extension. The non-target side elbow will be closer to the hip as well. Relax. Posture is level. Make some half swings first, hitting balls that are slightly teed up. Feel your rhythm. (possibly "shift swing, shift swing" or "toe up, toe up") If you hit behind the ball, your non-target side hand is releasing too soon. Once you hit some crisp shots, then play the ball down. Once you feel comfortable with half swings, then take 3/4 swings etc.

I hope you experience launching the ball versus hitting the ball.


